What is it?

The Pregnancy Risk Assessment Tracking System (PRATS) is an annual survey of new mothers in Idaho. It is a population-based tracking system that identifies and examines maternal experiences and health practices surrounding pregnancy which may affect pregnancy outcomes and infant health. PRATS was first conducted in Idaho in 1999, and has been conducted annually since 2001. PRATS is modeled after the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Pregnancy Risk Assessment Monitoring System (PRAMS).

This fact sheet summarizes major maternal health and behavior risk factors associated with maternal, fetal, and infant health outcomes. Results presented in this fact sheet are not inclusive of all data that may be provided by PRATS.
