IDAHO MEDICAID TRANSPORTATION BROKERAGE FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Question	Answer			
What is a transportation brokerage?	A transportation broker is a company that contracts with Medicaid to coordinate transportation benefits for Medicaid participants across the state.			
Who is Medicaid's transportation brokerage?	Medicaid has contracted with American Medical Response (AMR), the company that operates the Access2Care transportation systems, for its transportation brokerage.			
What does a transportation	Medicaid's transportation broker will:			
brokerage do?	 Operate a call center - Medicaid participants will call in to schedule a ride when they have no other means of accessing their Medicaid-covered medical care. 			
	2. Authorize transportation services - Based on information provided by participants, the broker will prior authorize appropriate non-emergent transportation services for them to access medical care when the they're unable to meet their own transportation needs or obtain help from friends, family, or community resources to meet those needs.			
	3. Assign participants to an appropriate provider for their transport - The broker will contract with transportation providers to create a statewide transportation network. The broker will assign one of its contracted providers to meet participants' needs once a ride is authorized.			
	4. Ensure high-quality transportation services are accessible to participants - The broker will monitor the transportation providers in the network to ensure that their vehicles are safe, their drivers are qualified and helpful, and that participants get to their medical appointments and services on time.			

Question	Answer			
When will these services begin?	The transportation brokerage will begin delivering services on September 1, 2010.			
Will AMR provide services directly?	No. AMR will only coordinate services and will not operate any vehicles under this contract.			
Why did Medicaid choose a brokerage?	A transportation broker can coordinate a network of providers to deliver improved services more efficiently and at a lower cost to Idaho taxpayers.			
Will the brokerage contract with all current Medicaid transportation providers?	In many cases the brokerage will contract with the same providers that serve Medicaid participants now. However, the brokerage is not required to sign contracts with current providers and may choose to contract only with the providers that can meet the needs of Medicaid participants most efficiently in a given area.			
Will rates for providers stay the same?	Not necessarily. The brokerage will pay rates that are adequate to ensure that high-quality transportation services are available to Medicaid participants when they are needed to access covered health care benefits.			
Will I be able to continue to receive reimbursement as an individual transportation provider for my own transportation, or for a friend or family member's transportation?	The brokerage will continue to contract with many individual providers. However, if there are other transportation options in your area that can meet the participant's needs more efficiently, the brokerage may assign the participant one of those options rather than a ride through an individual transportation provider.			
Will I be able to ride with the same provider that I have used in the past?	Many, but not all participants will be able to continue to use the same provider. Part of the purpose of using a brokerage is to coordinate transportation more efficiently and that may mean switching transportation providers for some or all of your appointments.			

Question	Answer					
Does AMR provide transportation for developmental disability agency (DDA) services?	AMR will schedule transportation to and from a DDA location. Transportation incidental to DDA services delivered in a community setting is not a part of Medicaid's non-emergency transportation benefit and will not be scheduled by AMR.					
Does AMR provide transportation for adult day care services?	No. Transportation to adult day care services may be arranged through the Bureau of Long Term Care or the Bureau of Developmental Disabilities as non-medical transportation. See the next question.					
Is AMR involved with non- medical transportation services?	No. AMR does not arrange non-medical transportation services available through Aid to the Aged, Blind, and Disabled (AABD) or Developmental Disabilities (DD) waiver services.
