Compatibility View for Internet Explorer 9 & 10

This is a quick setup guide for enabling Compatibility View in Microsoft Internet Explorer versions 9 and 10.

There are two ways to enable Compatibility View: Use the "Compatibility View settings" entry under the Tools menu, or use the icon at the far right of the address bar that will appear when Internet Explorer detects a website that is not 100% compatible

Option One - Compatibility View settings

The Compatibility View settings window will allow you to set which websites will always use Compatibility View.

First, open the Internet Explorer. By default, it hides the menu buttons until the Alt key is pressed on the keyboard. (Fig. 1)



The menu buttons will show after the Alt key is pressed. (Fig. 2)



Click the Tools menu to access the Compatibility View settings option. (Fig. 3)



After the Compatibility View settings option is clicked, the Compatibility View settings window will open. Next, type the name of the website that will always use Compatibility View into the field under "Add this website" and then click the Add button as shown in Fig. 4.

In this case, we type www.gainabs.org. When the Add button is clicked, the web address will be added to the list under "Websites you've added to Compatibility View" which means that Compatibility View will automatically be used every time you visit that site. (Fig. 5)

Option Two - Compatibility View icon

The alternative method is to use the Compatibility View icon in the upper right corner of the screen as seen in Fig. 6.



When Compatibility View is off, the icon will be a grey outline as seen in Fig. 6. Simply click the icon to toggle Compatibility View on and off again – Compatibility View may be enabled or disabled on any page in GAIN ABS. Once Compatibility View has been turned on, the icon will be a solid color as seen in Fig. 7. The color of the icon will depend on the current software configuration of your computer.
