#### **V. Subcommittee Reports to the Board**

##### Data/Legislative Subcommittee:

This committee is going to focus next on finding out where the data is and what kind of data it is; would it be helpful information for the Board?

We need data that will make us powerful when we make a presentation as a Board. Without data you are just discussing feelings.

Data from law enforcement would be important to gather. We will need to ask for specific information that we would want gathered and they could gather it.

Military OneSource <http://www.militaryonesource.mil/> is a good source of information for veterans and military.

Census data will be looked at.

Improving data collection is also important so that data is gathered and disseminated to the people who need it.

Coroner data on suicide would be important to know.

It would be good to get data related to gun deaths and mental illness which might reduce the stigma brought on by news reports.

NAMI has data that could be used.

##### Community Education/Prevention Subcommittee:

This subcommittee would like to bring awareness of mental illness to community members and educators:

There is a program called Mental Health First Aid that can train people to train professionals and teachers.

Scott Rasmussen will contact this program to see if we can get a training held here.

Mary Christy will check with CSI regarding a partnership program.

Mari Nelson will contact Anita Jones who is a Mental Health Facilitator through MBCC to find out what the process is.

“Invisible War” screening at CSI will be Feb. 22, 2013 at 6:00 in the Fine Arts Bldg.; for professionals only. This video talks about veterans and trauma.

The above screening/training would be helpful in the Blaine County area.

Member request:

Scott Rasmussen would like input by the Board on the issue of mental health and violence. There has been a lot of coverage in the media about the mentally ill population and their tendency to violence. Part of this subcommittee’s job is to provide anti-stigma and point out the facts of mental illness. The facts are that most people with mental illness are more likely to be victims rather than the perpetrator of violence.

How can we get the word out regarding the facts of mental illness?

The Board suggests a guest editorial or spot on KMVT by Scott Rasmussen. We need to use the same media that is perpetuating this misrepresentation.

Society tends to label horrific crimes as being done by someone with a mental illness because it is hard for people to believe that a person thinking properly would do such a thing.

Support Services:

We looked at what the gaps are and how we connect people to those services.

211 Help-line is a fairly good resource for people looking to get connected to services. The subcommittee is interested in finding out how they gather their list and how do they deal with crisis situations?

Who are the resources? – Medical doctors, school counselors, private counselors, county services, local hospitals, advocacy groups, law enforcement, service coordinators, shelters, veterans service coordinators, courts, religious organizations, etc.

Issues:

There is a grant for law enforcement and mental health collaboration. Rich Neu

Gaps in CIT process: Detention staff are in need of CIT training.

There is a wide diversity in services available at various schools. It would be good to have the same services available at all school locations.

Transportation issues continue to be a problem for people needing mental health services.

The GAP analysis that was done in the past could be looked at again.

Conclusion:

List of members: There isn't an actual member list yet since the Board has not been defined in Idaho Code yet.

Where are we addressing children's issues? The Issues Subcommittee will be looking at children's services. Under the Jeff D lawsuit the board is charged to track how we are doing regarding following the guidance of the lawsuit. The Board needs further direction from the Planning Council on what needs to be tracked. Without guidance we are just guessing at what they would be interested in.
