


WIA


PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must meet eligibility and residency requirements. Documents will be requested to confirm eligibility. WIA is not an entitlement program. Not all applicants will be enrolled.

PROGRAM SERVICES

The WIA youth program provides education, training, and employment opportunities for qualifying youth. Services are tailored to meet the specific needs of the individual and may include:

- ◆ Tutoring, study skills training, and instruction leading to completion of secondary school, including dropout prevention.
- ◆ Alternative school services
- ◆ GED preparation and testing
- ◆ Employment opportunities
- ◆ Work experience
- ◆ Occupational skills training
- ◆ Leadership development opportunities
- ◆ Supportive services such as transportation or childcare
- ◆ Guidance and counseling

PARTICIPANT ELIGIBILITY

Individuals must meet the following criteria to be eligible to receive services:

- ◆ Must be 16 to 21 years of age
- ◆ Must be a US citizen or eligible to work in the US
- ◆ Comply with Selective Service registration requirements
- ◆ Comply with local and state residency requirements
- ◆ Meet low income requirements (with some exceptions)
- ◆ Have an additional barrier to employment such as -
 - Dropped out of school
 - Homeless, runaway or foster child
 - Pregnant or parenting
 - Offender
 - Require additional assistance to complete educational program or secure employment
